
Conducting a Drinking Water Enforcement Inspection



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Why is the EPA inspecting my water system?

National Enforcement Compliance Initiative

- Reduce number of community waters in noncompliance with drinking water standards
- Support EPA's strategic plan
- Incorporate environmental justice

Safe Drinking Water Act

- Section 1445(b)(1) of the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA), 42 U.S.C. § 300j-4(b)(1),
- National Primary Drinking Water Regulations of Section 1412 of SDWA, 42 U.S.C. §300g-1

Targeting

Targeting begins a year in advance Criteria developed to query systems

- Meet with EPA state managers
- Meet with each state manager
- Generation Finalize list

The Inspection Process



Planning

- Choose facility to be inspected
- Inform State
- Review last two sanitary surveys
- Determine number of staff needed
- Rule applicability

- Enforcement determination

Inspection report

- 30-60 day Timeframe
- Copies sent to PWS & State

Enforcement

- Administrative Orders sent to system (*if applicable*)
- Show Cause Meeting with system
- Closure Letter
